



Declaration of Conformity pursuant to WEEE Directive 2012/19/EU and Battery Regulation (EU) 2023/1542

Purpose of the WEEE Directive and Battery Regulation

The WEEE Directive 2012/19/EU aims to protect the environment and human health by preventing or reducing the adverse impacts arising from the generation and management of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE). Its primary objective is to minimize the disposal of WEEE as unsorted municipal waste by promoting reuse, recycling, and other forms of recovery. The Directive also seeks to enhance the environmental performance of all economic operators involved in the collection, treatment, and recovery of such waste.

In parallel, the Battery Regulation (EU) 2023/1542 addresses the entire life cycle of batteries, including design, production, labeling, collection, and recycling. It aims to ensure that all types of batteries, especially those integrated into electrical and electronic equipment, are managed in an environmentally responsible way.

Together, these legislative frameworks form a comprehensive strategy for the sustainable management of electronic devices and their energy storage components, ensuring alignment with the EU's broader goals on waste reduction and environmental protection.

Meeting Requirements at Datalogic

Datalogic declares that its electrical and electronic equipment (EEE) and batteries are compliant with Directive 2012/19/EU (WEEE) and Regulation 2023/1542/EU, including all applicable updates.

All Datalogic products falling within the scope of these regulations are marked with the crossed-out wheeled bin symbol, shown on the equipment or its packaging. This symbol indicates that the product, at the end of its life, must not be disposed of with regular household waste, but must be collected separately for appropriate treatment and recycling.
